# A NEW KIND OF FLORIDA CITRUS SHOW IS ON TAP

The Florida Citrus Show has been a go-to event for the state's citrus producers over the years. The show will return to its normal time slot in 2022, slated for Jan. 26-27 at the Havert L. Fenn Center in Ft. Pierce.



This year's show will be celebrating the theme of “**We Believe in Florida Citrus**” and will feature some changes to the education program aimed at bringing growers more into the discussion. While half of the education program will feature recent research work conducted by **UF/IFAS** and **USDA**, the other half will focus on what growers are currently working with in the field. There will be several panel discussions comprised whereof growers can focus on several hot topics within the industry. Panels will include: a **CRAFT** program grower panel; a grower discussion on managing fruit drop; and a grower conversation on using modern SAP analysis to fine-tune nutrition programs.

Other panels will include a discussion on successful water stewardship cost-share collaborations. In addition, a panel comprised of industry suppliers will cover how currently available products and technologies can be deployed in the grove today to improve production.

## Opening Session

The opening session will focus on key industry issues facing Florida citrus. **Dr. Scott Angle**, Vice President of Agriculture and Natural Resources for UF/IFAS, will kick off the event off with a welcoming statement and an update from the university. Tory Rumenik, **Florida Fruit and Vegetable Association's** Commodity Services and Supply Chain Manager, will speak about current supply chain issues impacting Florida agriculture. **Florida Department of Citrus** economist Dr. Marisa Zansler will give an update on market conditions.

## Focused on Fruit Drop

After lunch on Thursday, the education program will turn to managing fruit drop. Panels and UF/IFAS researchers will address the problem that has plagued groves in recent years. Attendees will hear from growers on approaches they have deployed in groves to manage the problem, whether it be fine tuning nutrition programs, fungicide regimes, or other techniques.

# MUTUAL FOCUSES ON PRIORITIES GOING INTO 2022 LEGISLATIVE SESSION

Next week the 2022 State Legislative Session will officially kick-off. Florida Citrus Mutual has been a constant presence in Tallahassee for the past several months working with lawmakers and committee staff to ensure that we are well positioned to advance our priorities. Along with our traditional budget requests which include continued investments in both basic (CRDF) and applied (CRAFT) research, marketing, and new varieties development we continue to advocate for programs funded through FDACS that support the industry such as the Citrus Health Response Program (CHRP) and supplemental funding for the Citrus Inspection Trust Fund.

Mutual will also be working closely with Senator Danny Burgess and Representative Colleen Burton to advance the Citrus Recovery Act (SB 1002/HB 1097). This bill updates Florida Statutes chapter 601, the Florida Citrus Code. The proposed updates to 601 being considered this session include redistricting of the Florida Citrus Commission, requiring periodic reports be made to the Florida Citrus Commission on the projects funded by the State Treasury on citrus production research, and ensuring Florida growers have first right of refusal on any new citrus variety developed as a result of research funded with state dollars and maintain exclusive rights to these varieties for a period certain. Additionally, Senator Albritton has introduced SB 1000 to address several issues stemming from outdated science supporting IFAS recommended rates pertaining to BMPs. Specifically, SB 1000:

- Clarifies that nutrient application rate recommendations are general guidelines, not site-specific absolute rates, and may not take into account the latest methods of producing agricultural commodities or changes to nutrient application practices due to disease and new crop varieties, among other things.
- Authorizes the use of rate tailoring in recommended nutrient application rates when rate tailoring is supported by written recommendations from a certified professional.
- Provides a presumption of compliance with state water quality standards when producers implement rate tailoring in compliance with the statutes outlined in the bill.

This piece of legislation is a critical component of ensuring that citrus producers are able to continue to comply with Florida Best Management Practices while providing the proper nutrition to HLB impacted groves, and will be included in Mutual's priorities this session. With our usual legislative priorities as well as several substantive policy bills such as the Citrus Recovery Act and SB 1000 pertaining to BMPs this will be a very busy session for our industry. Given our strong relationship with the Governor's office and legislators, as well as the currently favorable state revenue picture, Mutual is confident we are well positioned to accomplish many of our priorities but as always, we will leave it all on the field in Tallahassee to ensure a successful outcome for Florida citrus.
